Bridlington Priory Choir

One of only three all-boys choirs in the area, the long musical tradition of Bridlington Priory dates back to 1450 when a Choir School was established for the education of twelve boys. Today this living tradition is continued by a choir of boys and adults under the leadership of the Director of Music, Paul Dewhurst.

The benefits of being a chorister are well documented. Music stimulates the same areas of the brain used in numeracy and literacy. As a group activity, choral singing influences not only the mental but also the behavioural and emotional development of the child. Reading, social and organisational skills are enhanced through membership of a choir, and helps to explain the success that many choristers achieve educationally and in later life.

As part of the Priory Choir choristers receive a free musical education with tuition in the theory of music; specialist vocal coaching; sight singing training; the opportunity to gain awards and exams through the Royal School of Church Music; and the offer of subsidised instrumental tuition.



The best part of all is that it is all free. Indeed, choristers get paid a small amount from the Priory which increases as they work their way through the choir with its different levels and awards.

The choir has an active social life with regular outings for the boys and social activities for choir members and their families.

In addition, the chorister would have the unique opportunity of performing many of the great masterpieces of church music to a high standard in beautiful surroundings. .

NB – From September 2021 Sunday commitments will alternate with the Girls' Choir meaning that choristers will normally only be required for Morning OR Evening service – not both.

Holidays:

 The choir is on holiday throughout August and for a period after Christmas and Easter.

Pay:

- For full choristers this ranges from £50 £180 per year, depending on attendance, bonuses and experience.
- Weddings: Additional payments are made for weddings and occasional extra services.

Social Activities:

- Choir Club: This is held on the first Sunday of each month from 7.40 – 8.30pm in the Church Rooms. Games of football, table-tennis, snooker and unihoc are played & food and drinks are provided.
- Choir Holiday: This is usually the first week of the summer holidays. In July 2019 the choir stayed at Much Wenlock in Shropshire and in July 2018 we went on our seventh concert tour to Bad Salzuflen, in northern Germany.
- Outings: There is usually one per term, e.g. in September 2019 the boys went to Flamingo Land Theme Park, Malton.
- Various Social and Fundraising Events for boys and parents are also included in the choir's programme throughout the year.
